Serbia's premier Aleksandar Vučić, said Friday he was ready to go to Srebrenica to honour the memory of 8,000 Bosnian Muslims killed by Bosnian Serbs two decades ago. "**As the prime minister of the Serbian government I'm ready to bow and pay my respects to the innocent victims of Srebrenica**", Vučić told reporters adding Belgrade "**despised**" those responsible for the massacre, which he described as "**a terrible and terrifying crime**", though he stopped short of using the word "*genocide*". The French government will provide support to Albanian institutions that fight corruption and prevent money laundering, the ambassador of France to Tirana Bernard Fitoussi said on Thursday. The Albanian director general of the Directorate for Prevention of Money Laundering, Genti Gazheli met with the Fitoussi and discussed further support from the French government to Albanian institutions in the fight against money laundering and corruption. Fitoussi stressed that Albania's EU integration includes some important priorities, one of which is the efficiency of the fight against corruption and the overall fight for the prevention of money laundering (Balkans.com, UK, 19/6).


EU and Serbia criticize Hungarian wall (Le Monde, FR, 19/6)

The European Commission announced that it did not approve the erection of wire fences along the borders of Europe. "*Recently we removed the borders in Europe and should not raise them again*" said European Commission spokeswoman Natasha Berto. Though it does not like border fences, the European Commission will not take action against countries that already erected them – Bulgaria, Greece and Spain, the spokeswoman added (24 Chasa, BG, 19/6). Meanwhile on Thursday the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia amended its asylum law, allowing those illegally entering the country to not be jailed if they leave within 3 days. This delay is also an opportunity to transit through the country legally (Index.hu, HU, 19/6).


