DG ELARG – 31st October 2012 Media Evaluation Summary Report

Summary

The European Court of Auditors (ECA) reported in a statement yesterday that EU help for Kosovo's police and judiciary "has had only modest success", and that Kosovo's judiciary

"continues to suffer from political interference, inefficiency and a lack of transparency and enforcement" BBC News reported (UK, 30/10) adding that Kosovo is the biggest recipient of EU aid per capita in the world. Acknowledging that rule of law started from a low base, the ECA commented that "nevertheless, the audit found that there were significant areas where better management by the EEAS and Commission could have made EU assistance more effective".

US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton began a five-nation Balkans tour yesterday, seeking to push regional leaders to stick to existing agreements and enact the reforms needed to join the EU and NATO according to lepopulaire.fr, (FR, 29/10). Accompanied by Catherine Ashton, High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Clinton's first stop was Sarajevo. Ashton and Secretary Clinton met the BiH Presidency to express support for the European perspective of a single, united and sovereign Bosnia and Herzegovina. The pair were due to underline the urgent need for party leaders to serve the interests of the people of that country and accomplish necessary reforms to become members of the European Union and NATO. A State Department spokesman said ahead of the trip." We are disappointed that the leaders of Bosnia and Herzegovina have often failed to put the interests of the country first and instead have promoted narrow ethnic, party or personal agendas". They also visited Serbia where Clinton and Ashton want dialogue and reforms from both Serbia and Kosovo. Dnevnik reported that the visit is taking place at an interesting time, when the Serbian political leadership is creating a platform for dialogue with Kosovo, which will spell out basic guidelines on key issues, but which, according to senior politicians, does not include the possibility of recognition of Kosovo's independence (Dnevnik, SI, 30/10). Clinton and Ashton will not officially set new conditions for Serbia according to Delo, (SI, 30/10) and Belgrade hopes this high-level visit is another step on Serbia's path towards European integration (Nepszava, HU, 30/10).

Elsewhere but still with accession negotiations, Bulgaria has once again expressed its support for Serbia and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (fYRoM) to join the European Union. Speaking in the south-western town of Blagoevgrad, Bulgarian Foreign Minister Nikolay Mladenov who had embarked on a 3 day journey along the border with the fYRoM to poll the opinions of the people living there in relation to Skopje's EU accession, stated that no other country would benefit more from their accession than Bulgaria. He also said that Bulgaria is concerned with the European Commission's progress report on the fYRoM, since key issues such as the problems of the Bulgarian minority in the country have not been included (novinite.com, BG, 30/10, 24-Chasa-Daily, BG, 30/10). Mladenov said that Bulgaria supports the fYRoM's EU bid, but not at any cost (Trud-Daily-Bulgaria, BG, 30/10).


