Summary

The EU calls on the leaders of Bosnia and Herzegovina to respond to people's concerns

The European Union (EU) should be more flexible over the integration of Bosnia and Herzegovina into the bloc, said Bakir Izetbegovic, Chairman of the Bosnia and Herzegovina Presidency. The EU will give Bosnia and Herzegovina nothing for free, but something can be done in parallel with the implementation of the ruling by European Court of Human Rights, Izetbegovic said. The EU can help Bosnia and Herzegovina in the fight against crime, use IPA funds to help young people there, and help to develop agriculture. The European Court of Human Rights ruling requires Bosnia and Herzegovina to change its Constitution on the grounds that it violates the European Convention on Human Rights. The EU has made the adoption of the ruling as a precondition for Bosnia and Herzegovina to join the bloc (neurope.eu, BE, 15/4). The Foreign Affairs Council consisting of EU member-states' foreign ministers on Monday considered the situation and concluded that "in the short term it is important for the institutions and leaders in Bosnia and Herzegovina to focus on a number of key priorities, particularly socio-economic issues and especially high unemployment among young people" (dalje.com, HR, 15/4).

Turkey urged executives from Twitter to open an office and start paying Turkish tax (uk.reuters.com, UK, 14/4)

Turkey and executives of the social networking site Twitter have held face to face discussions following a break down in relations. It comes in the wake of a ban on the site brought in by the government as it was fighting a corruption scandal. Twitter has also been accused of tax evasion. The government estimates that Twitter generates \$35 million a year in advertising revenue in Turkey, none of it taxed by Ankara. Two rounds of talks are scheduled. Twitter chiefs said the first round was positive (euronews.com, BE, 15/4).


International War Crimes Tribunal for Kosovo


