Kosovo Albanian guerillas murdered Serbs and sold their organs but there is not yet enough evidence to bring the guilty to justice, the chief prosecutor of an EU backed team of international investigators said. ***“There are compelling indications that this practice did occur [...] and that a small number of individuals were killed for the purpose of extracting and trafficking their organs,”*** Clint Williamson told reporters at a Brussels news conference. ***“There is probably no single thing that poses more of a threat to the rule of law in Kosovo and its progress toward a European future than this pervasive practice,”*** he added (euractiv.com, BE, 29/7).

Balkan relations with Russia

The West is giving no ultimatum to Serbia to force it to change its policy towards Russia Denis Keefe, British Ambassador to Belgrade, was reported as saying. According to Keefe, the country will play a positive role in the stabilisation of the region and the Western Balkans (focus-fen.net, BG, 28/7). In Montenegro, the Minister for the Economy Vladimir Kavarić announced that his country desired to be included in the South Stream gas pipeline project. *“South Stream is part of the diversification opportunities for our energy sources and also an opportunity to increase competitiveness of our economy. We have not yet received an official invitation, but there were negotiations with representatives of [Russian energy concern] Gazprom on that issue”* Kavarić was quoted by Montenegro's leading daily Vjesti as saying (novinite.com, BG, 28/7).


Name dispute

UN Special Representative for the naming dispute between Greece and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Matthew Nimetz, who arrived on a visit to Skopje Monday, is scheduled to meet with officials from the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. In the context of the current round of the negotiations on finding a solution to the name dispute, Nimetz is also scheduled to leave on the visit to Athens. In Skopje the UN diplomat will meet with the new negotiator for the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Vasko Naumovski, for the first time since latter's appointment on the post. On his arrival in the region, Nimetz said he was optimistic about finding a solution to the long-lasting dispute (focus-fen.net, BG, 29/7).
