Večernji list (HR, 9/9) writes that the possible surprise, when EC President-elect Jean-Claude Juncker announces his candidates for commissioners, will be the omission of a commissioner for enlargement. Mr Juncker has announced that enlargement will not be taking place during his five-year mandate and Mr. Juncker's spokeswoman Natasha Bertrand has reiterated this, adding that the process of EU enlargement will continue to happen, especially with the countries of the Western Balkans. Jutarnji list writes that Brussels does admit that Mr Juncker is giving priority to EU internal consolidation something which is shared by most of the EU.

#### **EU centralisation and Scottish independence**

In this commentary on the Scottish referendum over the country's secession from the United Kingdom, Fabian Leber writing in Tagesspiegel (DE, 9/9) notes that the EU made this development possible in the first place "with its emphasis on centralisation" and its ever-increasing supranational tendencies. Yet an accession to the EU for an independent Scotland will be fraught with difficulty as other member states with similarly heterogeneous structures such as Spain or Belgium will refrain from permitting it, lest they set an example for their own minorities. Furthermore, José Manuel Barroso has announced that Scotland will have to apply normally, just like Turkey, should it wish to join the EU.


#### **Accession a priority for Turkey**


