Summary

Serbian disagreement with EU

Serbian Prime Minister Aleksandar Vučić accused the European Union of leading a media campaign aimed at discrediting the government of the country. Analysts suggest that actions of Brussels are an attempt to put pressure on Belgrade following its refusal to accede to Western sanctions against Russia (Presa, BG, 12/1). The latest controversy pitches European Commission spokeswoman Maja Kotsiyanchich against Prime Minister of Serbia Aleksandar Vučić and shows that unfortunately members of the Serbian Government are not entitled to their own opinion, even when they want to protect the interests of Serbian citizens. This was announced by Minister of Internal Affairs of Serbia, Nebojša Stefanović. Stefanović explained the nature of the controversy between the government and the EC. He said that Serbia was not allowed to award a contract to pump water from the Tamnava mine to a Serbian company but were required to award it to a European company whose offer was three times more expensive than others. "We did not want to throw away 23 million of Euro citizens' money" said Stefanović (focus-news.net, BG, 12/1).

Prospects for the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia

After elections in Greece on 25/01/2015, there could be a new government in Greece, which would led by the Coalition of the Radical Left SYRIZA. While no fundamental change in the Greek attitude towards the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia is to be expected, bilateral relations could improve significantly. So possibly the accession talks between the EU and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia could at least get started. In parallel, there could be talks between the two countries to overcome the so-called name dispute within the EU. So far, the start of EU accession talks have been blocked by Greece until there is a solution to the name dispute. Current Prime Minister Antonis Samaras been a hardliner as concerns the name dispute but this may change if there was electoral success for the left in Greece. (Pelagon.de, DE, 12/1).


Turkish visit to Germany

ELARG: **Leading Daily Issues** by volume, favourability & rating




